- 2023 **Number of members reached to 35,000**

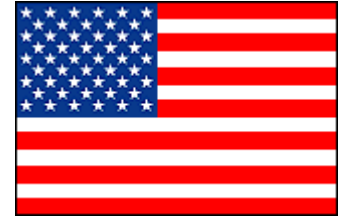

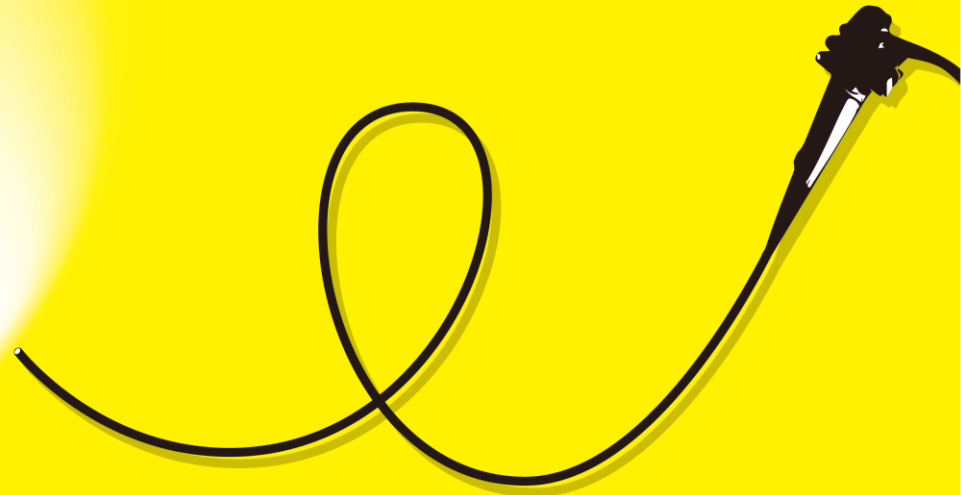
